2020 AIR Travel Grant Information

Purpose: To assist with expenses incurred while attending the <u>2020 AIR Forum in New Orleans</u>, LA on May 25-29.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Travel Grants are available to active members of the Louisiana Association for Institutional Research (active members are those who attended the LAIR 2019 Annual Conference or paid membership dues since that time).
- Members of the LAIR Executive Committee are not eligible for travel grants during their term. Travel grants are not transferable.
- Priority will be given to applicants who have not applied for a LAIR travel grant during the last application cycle (April 2019 November 2019); and who have not received additional funding from an outside source (AIR scholarship, travel grants, fellowships etc.)

Number and Amount of Grants: A total of 4 grants in the amount of \$500 are available. Only one travel grant will be awarded per institution.

Application Materials and Considerations: To be considered for the award, application materials must be submitted to the **LAIR President and Vice President**. The deadline for submission of application is <u>March 27</u>, <u>2020</u>. The following items must be submitted (see attached application form):

- 1. **APPLICANT INFORMATION:** Name, institution/organization of employment, work title, work address, and contact information
- 2. **STATEMENT OF WHY GRANT IS NEEDED:** Explain how receiving the grant will contribute to professional development, particularly with regard to any intent to present at the AIR Forum.
- 3. **STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL NEED:** Describe financial need and the financial support available from your institution and other possible sources.

Criteria for Awarding of Grants: The President and Vice President of LAIR will review the information submitted in the application materials and make recommendations to the LAIR Executive Committee who will approve the grant awards. Priority will be given to applicants who have never attended an AIR Forum before, who plan to present at the 2020 AIR Forum, or who have limited financial support from their institutions and/or other sources to attend the 2020 AIR Forum.

Recipients of the LAIR 2020 AIR travel grants will be notified via email by April 1, 2020.

- Office Operations & Functions Focuses on the operations and functions of IR and/or IE offices. Sample topics include request tracking, organizing/archiving past studies, staffing, resources, and relationships with other campus operational areas.
- <u>Planning & Assessment</u> Includes implementing assessment programs, goal setting/measuring, novel assessment ideas, accreditation topics, program review, and campus involvement in assessment.
- <u>Technology, Tools, & Techniques</u> Includes technology, tools, and techniques that are used for internal/external reporting, data display/dissemination, and decision support systems.
- <u>Educate Information Producers, Users, & Consumers</u> Demonstrates ways
 of training on the use of data and information to inform decision-making and
 includes discussion of way to collaborate with other stakeholder groups.
- <u>Current Issues & Research in Higher Education</u> Provides details on current topics and research within higher education.

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Potential session formats include:

- Speaker Session A 45-minute presentation by one or more presenters allowing time for Q & A.
- <u>Discussion Session</u> A 45-minute, moderated session that focuses on audience input and participation.
- Panel Session A 45-minute, moderated discussion among 2-4 panel members, each offering a unique viewpoint or perspective on a topic or issue.
